# CAN I VOTE?

**If you have a misdemeanor conviction, you can always vote.**

In fact, you always keep your right to vote unless you are currently serving a state or federal prison sentence.

**If you have a felony conviction, you can vote if:**

- You are on probation **OR**
- You are on post-release community supervision **OR**
- You are on mandatory supervision **OR**
- You are serving a county jail sentence under Realignment **OR**
- You are on parole.
